EXTRACTS FROM WAR DEPARTMENT (ARMY) HOSPITAL PAY RECORDS AND
MUSTER ROLLS OF NURSES, MATRONS AND ATTENDANTS (1861-1865),

SISTER "ADALIA" See listing for Sister Odelia (Hanora Higgins)

SISTER M. ADELA (Catherine Moran): " RED ROVER"

Shown to have been a nurse at the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City as early as March 1862. She transferred to the Navy Hospital Ship RED ROVER on 24 December 1864 and was still attached to the hospital department of that Navy Ship at last report (April 1865).

Sister M. Agnes (Bridget Nevilles)

A nurse at the Douglas U.S Army General Hospital in Washington, D.C. as early as 1 June 1862 and still serving as late as October 1865.

SISTER M. ALICE (Bridget Flannery)

Attached to the Satterlee U.S Army General Hospital of West Philadelphia as early as 23 July 1862 and still serving as late as October 1863.

SISTER M. ALOYSIUS (Mary Caren):

Record keepers on Western Waters had a time with this Sister despite the fact she signed "Aloysius". Alternate spellings of her name were "Aloises", "Alousius" and "Aloysious", " Aloysia", "Aloysus" and "Aloyisius." She served the Satterlee U.S. Army General Hospital of West Philadelphia from 9 June 1862, apparently transferred to the Overton U.S. Army General Hospital at Memphis by 11 August 1862, thence to the U.S. Army General Hospital of Wheeling, West Virginia, where she reported on 29 July 1864. Remarks regarding her service in the latter hospital read "Employed as a Matron to 25 November 1864, when she was re-employed as nurse by order of the Surgeon General of the Army. Other records bearing on 29 July-25 November 1864 show her employed as a cook. She was still serving in the Army Hospital in Wheeling as late as June 1865.

SISTER M. ANGELA (Mother M. Angela) (Eliza Gillespie)

Reported 15 November 1861 to the United States Army General Hospital of Mound City, Illinois. She signed "Angela" though record keepers spelled her "Sister M. Angels", "S. M. Angels", "Sister Angels" and "Sister M. Angela."

SISTER M. Angelica (Bridget O'Brien):

On certain records is entered "Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross." Known to have served the U.S Army General Hospital at Mound City from 31 October 1864 to 15 June 1865.

SISTER M. ANGELINE(Virginia Blake):

Served in the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City from 6 December 1861-6 June 1862 Served Saterlee U.S Army General Hospital of West Philadelphia, 3 September 1862 to as late as 31 December 1864.

Sister M. Ann (Mary Dorsey) [Sister M. Anne] ?

Sister M. Ann reported 17 November 1861 at the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City and was still serving there as of 30 April 1865. The speech of the Honorable Ambrose Kennedy of Rhode Island in the House of Representatives on Monday March 18, 1918, in support of House Joint Resolution 154 for the authorization of the Memorial to the "Nuns of the Battlefield" spells her name as Sister M. Anne. This speech was printed in the Government Printing Office in 1918 and the Monument was unveiled on Saturday, 24 September 1924.

SISTER M. ATHANASIUS (Margaret O'Neill): RED ROVER ?

She served at the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City from 19 November 1861 to as late as 30 June 1865. Only one entry indicates that she was ever absent from the Hospital. Her pay record for June 1862 says, "Paid for 1-22 June." One of the Sisters alleged to have served on the USS RED ROVER.

SISTER M. ANTHONY (Bridget Mannix):

Entered on most of her records is "Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross." She served the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City from September 12, 1862 to 30 July 1865 (Last record found).

SISTER M. AUGUSTA (Amanda Anderson):

She served the U.S. Army Depot General Hospital at Cairo, Illinois from 14 December 1861 to 30 December 1862. On 16 January 1863 she reported to the Overton U.S Army General Hospital at Memphis and was still serving there as of 30 June 1865. Her records at both locations shows her "Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross."

SISTER M. AUGUSTINA (Anne Flannagan.)

Though she signed her name "Augustina" she was sometimes carried under "Augustine". Her records show her to be a "Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross." She reported to the U.S Army Hospital at Mound City on 17 November 1861 and was still present as of 31 July 1865.

SISTER M. Callista (Esther Pointan) RED ROVER

Often her name is spelled "Calista". She served at the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City from 14 December 1861 and was "transferred to the steamer RED ROVER on 24 December 1862. She apparently transferred to the U.S Army Depot at Cairo, Illinois on 21 February 1863, again served the Mound City Hospital 28 February-31 July 1865. It is clear that Sister M. Callista served on both the USS RED ROVER and the Mound City Hospitals during certain periods as she is carried on the rolls of both hospitals. During the month of June 1862 she was entitled to pay for only "1-22 June." Entries regarding her often read "Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross."

SISTER M. FRANCIS (A. Molloy) p 3

All record entries found on this Sister agree: Reported to the U.S Army Hospital at Mound City on 17 November 1861 and still carried on the discharge roster date 31 July 1865.

SISTER M. Frances de Paul: No record found

Sister M. JOHN OF THE CROSS (Catherine McLoughlin) RED ROVER

Entered on records as "Sister St. John" but identified as "Sister of Charity, Order of Holy Cross." The only record found concerning her appears in the records of the RED ROVER and those emanating from the Holy Cross School of Nursing. The records of persons "not shipped" but attached to the Medical Department of RED ROVER, show the Sister came on board 9 February 1863 and she left the ship on 30 September 1863. It is known she headed the Nursing at the Hospital Pinkney in Memphis which was newly established in September 1863.

SISTER M. JOSEPHINE (M. Reilly)

Appears to have served at the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City from August 1861 to as late as 28 February 1865. On many pay and muster records of this hospital is the entry " Sister of Charity, Order of the Holy Cross." One "Sister Josephine" served the New House of Refuge, U.S Army Hospital at Saint Louis (23 August 1861- February 1863). Records conflicting on these Sisters cannot be reconciled.

SISTER M. ODELIA (Hanora Higgins)

Practically all records carry this Sister as "Adelia" She reported to the U.S Army General Hospital at Mound City on 19 November 1861 and the last record found shows here there as of February 1863.

SISTER M. PATRICK (Bridget McGookin):

Reported 19 November 1861 at the U.S Army General Hospital at Mound City, Illinois. The last entry found concerning this Sister is dated the period ending February 1863 .

SISTER M. PAULA (Winifred Casey)

Known to have served the U.S. Army General Hospital at Mound City, Illinois as early as February 1863 and as late as April 1863.

SISTER M. VERONICA (Regina Scholl):

RED ROVER

Served the U.S Army General Hospital at Mound City as early as February 1862 and transferred to the U.S Navy Hospital Ship RED ROVER on 24 December 1862. Believed to have taken charge of all nurses on the hospital ship as she is always listed first when the Sisters names are written together. She apparently served both the hospital ship and the Mound City Hospital when RED ROVER was at Mound City. Rolls of both places carry her during 31 December 1863-29 February 1864. During June 1862 she was eligible for pay at the Mound Cith Hospital for 1-22 June. During July 1862 she was eligible for pay for 1-18 July 1862. Where she was employed for the partial months is not known.

SISTER M. VICTORIA (M. O'KEEFE)

Served in the U.S Army General Hospital at Mound City, Illinois for 12 September 1862 to June 1864,
